

**Alan Campbell** is an artist from Athens and Savannah, Georgia who has earned wide recognition for his figurative watercolors and oil paintings depicting landscapes, wildlife and people from around the world, including Kenya, Ecuador and the Galapagos Islands, Italy, Alaska, Montana, Arizona, Maine, and closer to home, the coast of his native Georgia. As an expedition artist he has made numerous trips to Antarctica as a visiting artist with the National Science Foundation / U. S. Antarctic Program, and to Costa Rica and Peru with the Organization for Tropical Studies, helping elevate public awareness with exhibitions of the resulting paintings.

Campbell has had over 50 exhibitions in museums and galleries in the United States, Italy, Chile and New Zealand, with sponsorships from Mobil, AT&T, BellSouth, Lockheed Martin and the U. S. Embassy. He has received additional support from Patagonia, the Turner Foundation, R.E.M., and the Georgia Council for the Arts and Humanities, and has partnered with such non-profits as Earthwatch, The Nature Conservancy, African Wildlife Foundation, the Ossabaw Foundation, Earthshare, and the Explorers Club.

Alan Campbell's work has been featured in numerous periodicals and magazines, including *Reader's Digest*, *The Scientist*, *New York Times*, *Christian Science Monitor*, *New Zealand Herald*, *Georgia Alumni Magazine*, and *Explorers Journal*. His unusual career has also received wide exposure in television and radio, including *Georgia Public Television* and National Public Radio's "*All Things Considered*". He has lectured widely in the U. S., Chile and New Zealand, including appearances at the U. S. Embassy (NZ), the Smithsonian Institution and The Explorers Club in New York, where he was elected a Fellow in 2004.

In 2010, Alan Campbell returned to his family roots with a move to Savannah to focus on the remote barrier islands, working watermen and Gullah-Geechee communities of St. Helena and Sapelo Islands. His work is represented by the Morris & Whiteside Gallery on Hilton Head Island, S.C.
